



On Sunday, March 29, 2020, President Trump had earlier described an imaginary scene of full church pews on Easter Sunday. Due to the continued growth of the virus, this will not take place and the Federal Guidelines for social distancing and other mitigation measures will remain in place through April 30. The Tri-State area, in which BRBA operates in, will continue to follow the guidelines in place by the government within our country and their specific state Governor.

The CARES Act was signed into law on Friday, March 27, 2020 which provides up to \$2 trillion dollars in assistance for small businesses, non-profits (including churches and Associations), to preserve employment of employees during the COVID-19 crisis, .

Thank you to Director of Missions Larry Steen, Mid-Maryland Association for the following summary of how churches can receive the **CARES Act** funding.

- **Benefits to the church:** The act provides a one-time **forgivable loan** to a church in the amount of 2.5xs the average monthly **payroll** based on **FTEs.** Example: Annual payroll \$120,000. Monthly payroll + \$10,000. Loan amount = \$25,000.
- Within the next 3 months, your church is qualified to receive a grant of 2.5 times one month's payroll expense as a FORGIVEABLE loan from the Small Business Association. The loan is forgivable (does not need to be repaid) so long as you do not lay off employees between now and the end of June.
- You need to apply for this loan quickly there are millions of small businesses that will be applying. Thom Rainer recommends going through a company such as Cheney and Associates to apply for this "Forgivable loan." Steve Chaney and Associates is already geared up to handle the application process and can put your application in the front of the line. Rainer asserts he can, save you time, headaches and perhaps money. Cost. \$275 deposit, \$425 total for a church with 0-5 employees. - Are There Government Strings Attached? Is this an Ethical Issue or a Stewardship Issue?: Strings? Only two the conditions listed above for making the loan forgivable. The Government makes no requirements about what we can or cannot preach. Ethical the government has shut us down for public health reasons, not religious reasons. The Government wants to keep people safe and employed through the crisis, and the CARE Act is designed to help that.

"A MESSAGE FROM YOUR D.O.M"

When traditional life is altered, stress quickly follows. We're comfortable in our daily routines and enjoy the rhythms and conveniences of modern-day living. Unmet expectations can bring frustrations and anxiety.

There's no question we're in a difficult season and sailing uncharted waters. Lately, it seems like bad news continues to flow with each new newscast. Yet, the Lord remains in full and complete control.

For perspective, I want to walk you through a nearly impossible situation the early Church found itself in almost 2,000 years ago. The early Christian Church was marked by suffering, specifically persecution, but also plagues and disease that indiscriminately ravaged populations.

One of the deadliest pandemics occurred between AD 249 and 262, where up to 5,000 people in Rome were dying – per day. While many non-Christians concentrated on saving only themselves, it was the Christians who remained and served those who were suffering. They made a tremendous impact. In fact, some believe their heroism was rewarded in the form of those servants being able to build up personal immunity to the disease.

A similar scenario occurred a century later, and Julian, the Roman emperor at the time, lamented that the church's growth was due to Christians' "benevolence to strangers, their care for the graves of the dead, and the pretended holiness of their lives." Emperor Julian of Rome was disgusted, not entirely by their charity and sacrifice – but by the absence of a equivalent bravery and loving care from his own people. "For it is a disgrace that...the impious Galileans [Christians] support not only their own poor but ours as well," he said.

The current coronavirus crisis we find ourselves in may not rise to the level of what the early Christian Church faced. And I am not suggesting believers need to flood hospitals to help, but each of us has to ask God: "What do you want ME to do during this unprecedented health crisis?"

In the BLUE RIDGE ASSOCIATION we have believers from our churches that are checking on the elderly who live nearby, furnishing lunches to local hospital workers, running errands for those in need, picking up groceries or prescriptions for friends and neighbors. What can you do to help someone in need during this time of uncertainty?

Of course – there are those among us who can't do much because of being highly vulnerable to this virus...those who need special care and protection. Those who must confine themselves as much as possible.

I do believe though, that the comparison to the early Church is helpful because it reminds us that terrible times should not slow us down or impede the mission of our ministry that is ordained by God to bring the Gospel to a hurting world. As this COVID-19 pandemic moves forward with many twists and turns, may we model the same courageous and sacrificial attitude shown by our brothers and sisters in the early church.
