From Your Director of Missions...

I must admit ... I have never in my 6+ decades of life on this planet experienced anything like the hardship of these last few years. Then, just when I thought much was behind me - we experience a global pandemic that has taken the lives of over 2 million people worldwide, and the numbers are still climbing.

What we have all experienced seems at times like an apocalyptic movie. Lock downs, supply shortages, people running around wearing masks, restrictions on church assemblies. More people feel their mortality looming now than probably ever before. The fragility of life is on display before our very eyes. People are asking more spiritual questions about God than ever before! Anxiety and depression become rampant in this COVID-19 world we find ourselves in.



Throughout scripture we see examples of God's people who went through all kinds of severe hardship.
