

### OUTDOOR MOVIE EQUIPMENT COMING SOON TO BRBA

The Blue Ridge Baptist Association has been approved to receive a \$4,000 grant from our partners in the Baptist Convention of MD/DE to purchase and assemble an outdoor portable theater set up, including an inflatable large projection screen and a high lumen output video projector. Once assembled, any BRBA church will be able to borrow the system at no cost for outdoor movie showings and / or outreach events. BRBA will cover the cost for licensing to show certain films to small crowds.

We're grateful for the grant, and will keep you posted as the theater equipment becomes ready!

#### From your Director of Missions ....

So many of our churches are excited to begin scaling back on COVID safety measures that have fractured weekly church attendance and participation, and I am thrilled too. The scourge of Covid-19 can't go away fast enough for me. Thanks be to God for his provision and protection in and out of difficult times, and I commend each and every one of our churches for all that you have done to continue ministry, while also keeping your church families safe.

As summer begins - and we all get back to some sense of normalcy - I would like to encourage everyone not to rush the process, but to enjoy the experiences that we will all soon share - to hug and love on family and friends who we previously kept at a distance. If some folks still feel the need to continue to wear masks, or social distance a bit - don't think poorly of them, and please respect their decisions to do so. I know that with my liver transplant history, I still have to be somewhat careful, even though I am vaccinated. Psalm 133 says it best; *"Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!"* I'm SO looking forward to some of that!

Let me also challenge you to support **SKYCROFT** Baptist retreat center this summer whenever they advertise an event, or offer a camp opportunity. The last 16 months with Covid has been brutal on them financially, emotionally, and logistically - but they have weathered the storm very well. Please pray for the **Southern Baptist Convention** annual meeting and convention in Nashville in June too. There has been more than a little turmoil behind the scenes in the SBC, and a new President of the Convention will be selected who might facilitate healing, correction, and pave the way for God's Holy spirit to be released in a fresh way our denomination and churches.

As the Blue Ridge Baptist Association begins to exit the Covid-19 season, we find ourselves in financial downturn that has taken a toll. In April we spent about \$1,700. more than we brought in from our churches. If your church has fallen behind in sending gifts, please catch up. If there is a way that you could give a little more to local missions as you plan your 2022 budget, then please consider that as well.

Taking into consideration the financial downturn of the last 2 years, BRBA is making the following very difficult decisions to cut costs, and balance our budget:

1) Our administrative assistant's hours are being reduced by 50% effective June 1, 2021. If you contact Karen, it may take a bit longer to get a response to your email or voice mail message, but she will still respond to your needs as promptly as possible.

2) For 19 years BRBA has been the only Association in our region that paid for web and computer support, IT/ Tech advising, and building of web sites for each and every church that had need. This has been an amazing accomplishment, and has helped many of our church plants and small churches with consulting in a field where hiring a professional can be quite costly.

I regret to report that effective July 1, 2021 - BRBA will no longer be able to offer the services of Phil Graves free of charge. After 19 wonderful years of service, his tenure as a staff member and part-time contractor will come to an end. DON'T WORRY though, Phil will still be available to help your church directly through his private company, ALL SAINTS MEDIA, should you make the choice to use his services. *(Of course - you can select any contractor you choose.)* If your web site hosting is still through BRBA - and you wish to keep it with us (we'll probably be cheaper than what you could arrange privately) BRBA will start sending our churches bills for those costs so that they no longer fall on us. This is a sad end to a very great benefit to our churches, but budget constraints will no longer allow us to offer all of this as a free service to member churches. We will honor Phil at our October annual meeting for his many years of faithful service to BRBA!

3) BRBA is considering selling our Disaster Relief Communications RV and ending that investment into our DR involvement. The aging 1995 Winnebago is supported almost totally by the association, but is rarely used - even during hurricane season. If you know of anyone who might want to purchase this RV (less than 50,000 miles) please contact the association office.

I have heard so many people say: "I can't wait for things to get back to normal", As your associational missionary - I feel the need to remind you however that God often takes us through drastic life experiences in order to create a NEW normal. He changes things up. Would every BRBA church be able to simulcast or live stream bible studies or services 2 years ago? NO! In Isaiah 43:18 + he says to us: "Do not call to mind the former things; pay no attention to the things of old. <u>Behold, I am about to do something new; even now it is coming.</u> Do you not see it? Indeed, I will make a way in the wilderness and streams in the desert."

BRBA stands ready to assist your church with whatever your *new normal* may be. May God bless you all as you find your way forward in Kingdom work!

#### CONGRATULATIONS

Phil Graves, Senior Pastor at First Baptist Church of Brunswick, grins when he tells how his wife, Kristie, approached him with the idea of adopting a second child who has special needs. "She wanted me to tell her she's crazy." But Phil didn't tell Kristie she was crazy. Instead, they traveled across the world just four years ago to bring their daughter, Elliana, home from Armenia. It was an exciting journey, but took a lot of strength. The Graves are ready to once again adopt a child. This time it's a little girl named Bridget, living in a Ukrainian orphanage. Five-yearold Bridget has become sadly famous throughout the internet. Her American parents, unable to have children, arranged for a surrogate. Tragically, her parents abandoned the child when she was born at 26 weeks with physical and mental disabilities.

**If God leads, He will provide provisions for the trip** The Graves said they learned with Elliana that if God opens a door and directs them on a path, He will provide the finances. And they're leaving Brigit's adoption expenses up to Him once more.

It will take at least \$40,000 to adopt Bridget and bring her home. Without advertising, just sharing their story, they have about half of what they need. The couple has a webpage, *PhilandKristie.com*, which shares their story and provides a tax-free opportunity to donate towards the adoption expenses. They hope to finalize the adoption by the end of the year.

#### SBC ANNUAL MEETING AND CONVENTION

The 2021 SBC Annual Meeting will move to the Music City Center in downtown Nashville, TN on June 15-16.

According to Ronnie Floyd, president and CEO of the SBC Executive Committee, the shift was made in order to allow adequate space to "provide abundant space conducive to holding a meeting that is efficient, effective and safe for every attendee" while adhering to local COVID-19 protocols. He said the decision was made in collaboration with the City of Nashville, the Gaylord Opryland Resort and Convention Center, the Nashville Convention and Visitors Corp., and the Music City Center, and thanked the organizations for what he described as "incredible efforts" during recent weeks.

"The SBC Annual Meeting is a time for Southern Baptists to come together and celebrate how God is moving in and through our convention and churches," Floyd said. "It will be a time for Southern Baptists to reconnect with one another after missing out on a gathering in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic."
