<u>Congratulations to Harold Renner - The New Spiritual</u> <u>Leader at Greenbrier Baptist Church</u>

Harold Renner is starting something new in his 50's. He is becoming a bi-vocational church leader. The former USAF mechanic / home builder has spent the last 20+ years working in the information technology field. Never did he think that his life would take the many twists and

turns of the last 5 years ... but as one of his former pastors once told him, "God has a plan and we're part of it."

In mid-2017 Harold experienced what he believed was a calling to preach. It was the last thing on his mind at the time, but was unmistakable. Shortly thereafter, he says that life went into shambles. Everything that could go wrong - did go wrong. But through it all he had faith that God was always there with him in the storms - and the calling was always there in the background. "I was in no



shape to lead myself, much less lead a church" said Renner, and it took time for those storms to pass and life turmoil to settle down. He is thankful these days of the reminder that God often uses the weak to lead - providing them with divine strength in ministry and service to others.

This year, he says, the calling wouldn't let him rest. He could not bear the thought of facing his Savior one day, trying to explain why he never followed through on the calling. So when

Pastor Dave Hughes resigned the pastorate at Greenbrier Baptist (stepping back into retirement), Harold stepped out in faith once again towards the call. This time things were different. God had calmed all the storms. Harold had been humbled by experiencing them and there became a grounds well of support from the membership of Greenbrier Baptist Church, who asked him to lead the church family.

BRBA paired him with a sister congregation in the Association, Smithsburg Valley Church, and they are now working with Harold to license him to preach the gospel. He is also researching educational opportunities so that he can better serve the congregation in the future and ultimately will be seeking to become ordained.

"I am steadfast in knowing that there is nothing special about me that makes me worthy of God's calling. As a bond-servant to Him I want to fully submit to His will and to lead in whatever direction God has in store for the future of His church and His people."

WAR Mission Trip: Ramp Project - August 3-7th



BRBA has partnered with Calvary Baptist Church in War, WV to assist the impoverished and flood ravaged small town of War, WV.

• A team is scheduled to go to War August 4-7 to build an 80' handicap ramp for a family in the community whose husband/father recently had a stroke. BRBA is funding the project.

A Fresh Perspective on Supporting Christian Based Ministries

Many of you know that in addition to working full time as your local Director of Missions, I still work one or two days a week doing security work. As a retired policeman, there is an old saying: "Old cops never die, they just work security" and I guess that has come true in my life as well.

I don't particularly enjoy security work; most times I have to travel to some of the worst crime ridden neighborhoods of Baltimore City or Prince George's County and protect people in hard working jobs from becoming the victims of crime. It's the nature of the work. But this past month I had the privilege of doing a different kind of security work that touched my heart and changed my perspective regarding our many local churches supporting Crisis Pregnancy Centers in our region.

In May, a draft opinion from the Supreme Court was leaked to the press saying that the high court was considering overturning Roe vs. Wade decision of 1973. There was an immediate response from pro-abortion activists and it got ugly pretty quick. Pro-life Christians have been praying for 50 years for this day to come but the deliverance that finally came, threw up cautionary red flags everywhere. Extremists went on record warning that if the court did decide to overturn Roe vs. Wade, the action would be followed by "a night of rage" or "a night of terror". Homeland Security put out warnings about possible attacks of churches that support anti-abortion causes, including local crisis pregnancy centers. In June, at the end of the court's session, the rule to overturn Roe vs Wade was officially released. Roe was dead!

I had been contacted by the Board of Directors of the CareNet Pregnancy Center in Frederick, MD asking if I could help them with some security services during a very anxious period of time. I happily answered the call. Many of our churches support this center throughout the year with various fundraisers and gifts. Our BRBA treasurer serves on the board there so it was a no-brainer to help them out in their time of need. What transpired over the next few weeks was much more than me just doing another security gig.

As I served the center I got to witness some amazing things. I met the employees and volunteers that work there and saw their hearts in wanting to preserve the lives of defenseless infants and love on new moms who find themselves in very difficult circumstances. Their dedication to the task at hand was more than compelling. I saw young mothers coming every day, some by car and others pushing a stroller multiple blocks though the City of Frederick, to get their baby needed items or a check up. I saw girls coming in for counseling support. Senior citizens would come by bringing cases of diapers or baby formula that they had purchased to donate to the center. The whole picture of the operation was amazing to me and I saw through fresh eyes how God can weave together a wonderful network of love and help through individuals, churches, and other various resources. My life was changed in how I viewed support of such para-church organizations and the importance of their work. I want to challenge you and your church in the future, when you support a local center like this in the future with campaigns, like filling baby bottles with coins, take some time to go deeper. Meet the people who work and serve there. Get to know them and their calling in this work. Drop off lunch one day. Tell them you appreciate them. If you can, volunteer to pick up some duties that need to be addressed. After my experience I can tell



you, you'll be more than blessed for digging in a bit deeper.

2 Cor. 9:8 reminds us; "God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."
