

LET'S TALK VBS!!!!

As this newsletter is being published - about 70% of our churches have had Vacation Bible Schools or summer camps to reach children and youth. Many more will host such events in August up until school starts.

VBS can be a great experience for children and adult volunteers. Once again, BRBA is grateful for our partnership with SKYCROFT CONFERENCE CENTER for sending our churches some summer missionaries to help many of our churches!

Here are 3 reasons (from our partners at Lifeway Christian Resources) why your church should consider doing a VBS or summer camp in the future, if you're currently not doing one:

1. VBS IS A DEPENDABLE ONGOING OUTREACH.

THE IMPORTANCE OF UNITY IN GOD'S FAMILY

One of the biggest problems in the body of Christ is disunity. Christianity has been fragmented and splintered into so many groups and denominations that our effectiveness seems to have been diminished. After all, how are we supposed to teach the world about truth when our internal disputes cause us to disagree with each other so much?

Far too many Christians are more concerned with minor disagreements than they are with sharing the gospel and expanding the body of Christ. We can have differences of opinion and that is not necessarily a bad thing because humans are thinkers and we have opinions. But our differences must always be clothed with humility and love. When differences of opinion become more important than the unity within the body of Christ, then trouble creeps into the church and also into our hearts.

Paul said to the church at Ephesus: "I therefore, a prisoner of the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ²with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. ⁴There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call; ⁵one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. ⁷But grace was given to each on of us according to the measure of Christs gift ¹²to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up of the body of Christ; ¹³until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature to the fullness of Christ," (Eph. 4:1-7,12-13).

Paul's challenge is for unity. Because we are saved by the Lord Jesus, we must look to Him and remember HIS humility, and do our very best to emulate Christ. We cannot be unified if we are elevating ourselves above others and squabbling over lesser concerns while people are headed for an eternity without Christ.

1 Corinthians 1: 10-13 says: "I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. 11 For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brothers. 12 What I mean is that each one of you says, "I follow Paul," or "I follow Apollos," or "I follow Christ." 13 Is Christ divided?"

God puts a group of people together in a local representation of HIS church (not ours) for a reason, so that TOGETHER, in unity, we can all contribute to the glory of God and to further His kingdom under the truth that is the gospel. It should be a joy, not a burden.

Should we allow the enemy to sow discord among our ranks so that we are fighting each other? NO! We should gather our gifts, our talents, our monies, our resources, and direct them towards reaching the lost. Mother Theresa once said: "If we have <u>no peace</u>, it is because we have <u>forgotten</u> that we <u>belong</u> to each other."

May we put our eyes on Jesus and ask Him to use us, to humble us, and to cause our hearts to elevate the preaching of the gospel to the high rank it deserves, <u>far above our differences</u>.

Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brothers to dwell together in unity. Psalm 133:1

To Jesus be all the glory.
